The Third Sunday of Advent Gaudete Sunday

Sunday 14 December 2025

Welcome to worship.

Today is the **Third Sunday of Advent**. The season of Advent is traditionally a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both Jesus' birth at Christmas, and the return of Jesus at the Second Coming. The liturgical colour for this season of penitential preparation is **purple**. In the Sarum Rite, **blue** is also appointed for this season, symbolising hope, expectation, and the anticipation of Christ's birth. On this **Gaudete Sunday**, the readings emphasise that joyous anticipation of the Lord's coming. **Rose pink** is, therefore, the liturgical colour for this Sunday, along with **purple** and **blue**.

Hymns are unannounced and sung standing unless otherwise indicated. Please ask one of the Duty Elders if there is not a hymnbook (purple Church Hymnary) near your seat.


