The Second Sunday of Advent

Sunday 7 December 2025

Welcome to worship.

Today is the **Second Sunday of Advent**. The season of Advent is traditionally a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both Jesus' birth at Christmas, and the return of Jesus at the Second Coming. The liturgical colour for this season of penitential preparation is **purple**. In the Sarum Rite, **blue** is also appointed for this season, symbolising hope, expectation, and the anticipation of Christ's birth.

This morning, we welcome the Revd Angus Mathieson to lead our worship.

Hymns are unannounced and sung standing unless otherwise indicated. Please ask one of the Duty Elders if there is not a hymnbook (purple Church Hymnary) near your seat.

Bible Readings are taken from the New Revised Standard Version. Please ask one of the Duty Elders if you would like a copy.


Please join us after the service in the Lammermuir Hall for tea and coffee.
